



The National JOTA Organizer:

- functions at a national level within his Scout Association (most NJO's are a member of an Association's international committee);
- is preferably someone with his own amateur radio licence, or at least with a vast knowledge of amateur radio;
- has the required organizational skills to support the Scout stations participating in the JOTA in his country;
- is the Scout Association's representative to the national amateur radio organization;
- communicates directly with the World JOTA Organizer at the World Scout Bureau;
- receives the full support, both organizational and financial, from the Scout Association's headquarters.

Countries with large numbers of Scouts taking part often have a team to assist the NJO, a radio-scouting committee. The actual organization details differ from country to country, depending on local needs and regulations.
